Cattle Knocking Box

Design, fabrication and installation of a unique cattle knocking box

he Wulguru Group, through our Archimedes Engineering business, were approached by a large beef abattoir company to design, fabricate, install and commission a new knocking box for their Central Qld operation. It was specified that they wished to increase their capacity from 90 to 120 head per hour whilst not increasing staffing required for this process. It was also extremely important to these clients that the plant downtime was kept to a minimum while these works were undertaken.

Wulguru Group have a unique design for a cattle knocking box that not only accounted for these requests from the client but also incorporates benefits such as:

- · Minimal wear components with easy access for maintenance purposes;
- High workplace health and safety standards with an ergonomic design for the operator;
- Stainless steel construction for health requirements.

The knocking box was fabricated within our workshop limiting risks such as safety, quality and timeframes traditionally associated with site works. It is a semiautomated design that is operated by only 1 person and adapts to a complete range of cattle sizes. The total plant shutdown, incorporating the removal of the existing facility and the installation and commissioning of the new knocking box, was completed in 17 days.
